Ahmedabad is ever inspiring*

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SABARMATI ASHRAM

This historic ashram was the home of Mahatma Gandhi and his followers from 1917 to 1930. It is a place of great significance to India's freedom struggle and is now a museum dedicated to Gandhi's life and work.



ADALAJ STEP-WELL

This five-storied stepwell with 16 platforms was built in 1498. The walls are carved with intricate designs, including deities, animals, and geometric patterns. The stepwell was used by pilgrims and traders as a place to rest and replenish their water supplies.



HUTHEESING TEMPLE

Hutheesing Temple was constructed in 1848. It blends the old Maru-Gurjara temple architecture style with new architectural elements of haveli in its design.



AKSHARDHAM TEMPLE

Dedicated to Bhagwan Swaminarayan, it is one of the grandest and most architecturally stunning temples in India. It is also a significant cultural and educational center, admired for its architecture, spirituality, and exhibitions.



HERITAGE WALK



A guided walking tour that offers a fascinating journey through the city's historical gems. It begins at the serene Swaminarayan Temple, an architectural marvel with intricate carvings. The walk then leads to Bhadra Fort, a majestic fort showcasing Mughal and Indo-Saracenic influences. Wandering through the Pols of Ahmedabad, you'll explore the historic residential neighborhoods and their intricately designed wooden havelis. These havelis, like hidden treasures, tell stories of a bygone era. Lastly, the Chabutro, or bird feeder, is a unique aspect of the city's heritage, embodying its commitment to harmony with nature. Together, these landmarks make the Heritage Walk an enriching experience, offering a glimpse into the history, culture, and architectural grandeur of Ahmedabad.

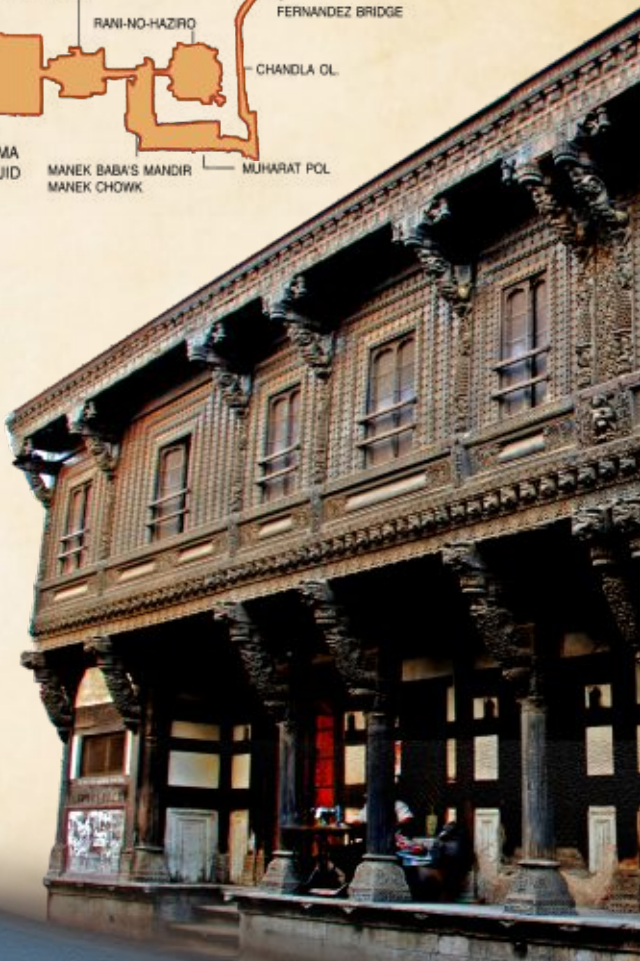

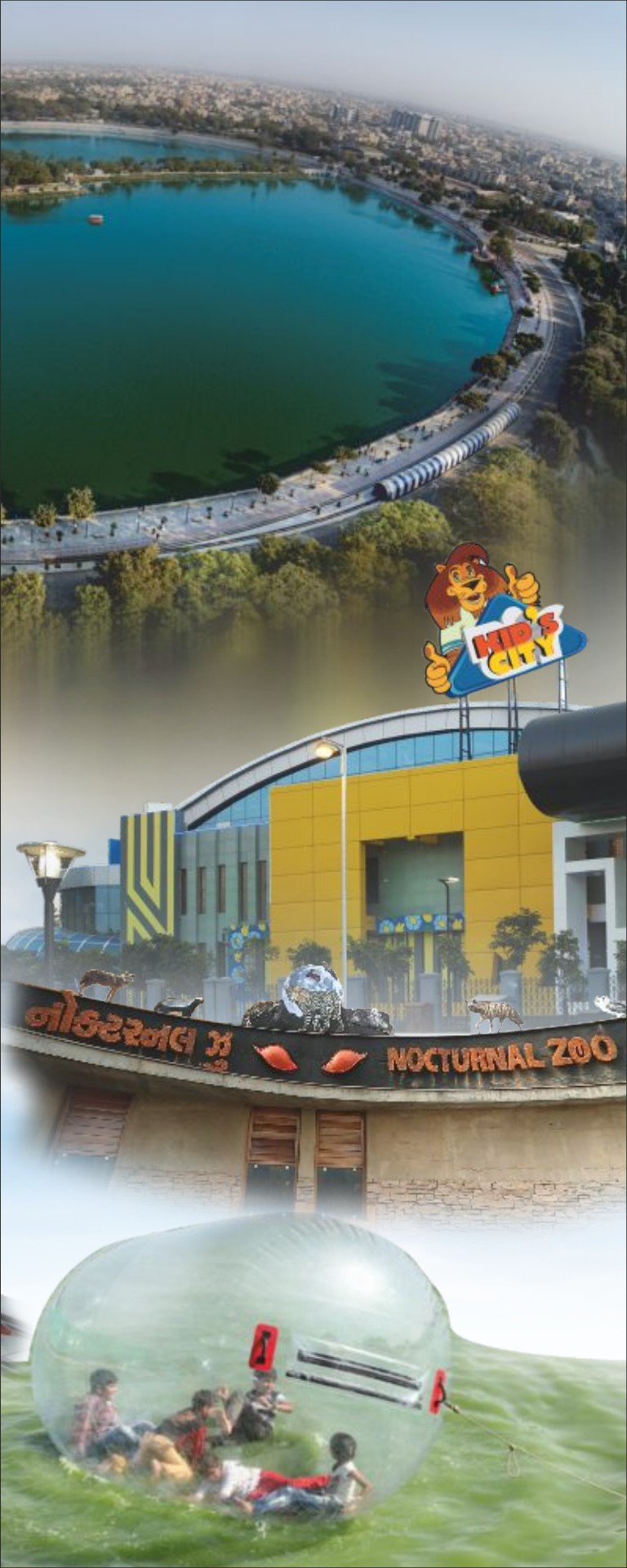




KANKARIA LAKE

This artificial lake is one of the most popular family picnic and recreational spots in the city, offering a blend of natural beauty, leisure activities, and cultural attractions. It houses a Nocturnal Zoo, a Butterfly Park, mesmerizing Light & Sound Show, Kids City & Toy Train, Boating, Jogging, Walking. The food stalls serve delectable traditional snacks.







SIDI SAIYYED MOSQUE

Built in the late 16th century, the mosque reflects the fusion of Indo-Islamic architecture and is most famous for the intricately carved lattice work screens on the windows. One such is the "Tree of Life," - a stone tracery depicting a tree with intertwining branches and foliage.



JAMA MASJID

This 15th century mosque built of red stone and marble is a blend of Indo-Islamic and Mughal architecture decorated with intricate carvings of Islamic motifs, including geometric patterns, flowers, and animals.



SCIENCE CITY

An interactive and engaging complex designed to promote scientific awareness, curiosity, and learning among visitors, especially students. It houses Interactive Exhibits, an IMAX 3D Theater, a Planet Earth Pavilion, a Hall of Space, an Energy Education Park, an Aquatic Gallery, a Life Science Park, Thematic Exhibits, and an Amphitheater



AMDAVAD NI GUFA

An innovative and architecturally unique underground art gallery and exhibition space, representing the fusion of art and architecture.

The design of the Gufa allows natural light to filter in through various openings and skylights, creating an artistic interplay of light and shadow within the gallery. The interior murals are painted by the legendary M F Husain himself, reflecting his artistic vision and expression.

MUSEUMS

The bustling bazaars are vibrant hubs of commerce and culture, each offering a unique shopping experience.

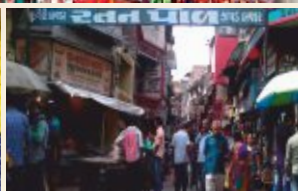
The **Law Garden**, known for its evening market, for shopping traditional handicrafts, textiles, and jewelry.

Sindhi Market a destination for fabric and garment shopping including silk, cotton, and more.

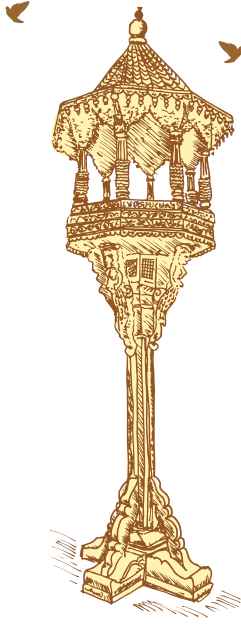


FOODS
