




AWES ME AHMEDABAD




ADALAJ STEP-WELL

This five-storied stepwell with 16 platforms was built in 1498. The walls are carved with intricate designs, including deities, animals, and geometric patterns. The stepwell was used by pilgrims and traders as a place to rest and replenish their water supplies.




Hutheesing Temple was constructed in 1848. It blends the old Maru-Gurjara temple architecture style with new architectural elements of haveli in its design.





AKSHARDHAM TEMPLE




SIDI SAIYYED MOSQUE

Built in the late 16th century, the mosque reflects the fusion of Indo-Islamic architecture and is most famous for the intricately carved lattice work screens on the windows. One such is the "Tree of Life," - a stone tracery depicting a tree with intertwining branches and foliage.



JAMA MASJID



An innovative and architecturally unique underground art gallery and exhibition space, representing the fusion of art and architecture.



The **Kite Museum** with over 5000 rare and antique collection of kites of different sizes, shapes, colors and from different regions, is a unique and colorful tribute to the city's passion for kite flying.

Dhalgarwad is a historic market where one can find a wide range of traditional Indian clothing, including sarees, dress materials, and accessories.


Ratanpol is a great place for bulk buyers, and you can find items ranging from textiles to hardware and electronics.
